FARM semi-annual ACUC inspections

This guide sheet is intended to provide an outline of items commonly cited by Animal Care and Use Committees (ACUC) during semi-annual inspections of farms: it does not present a comprehensive list of requirements for animal use. Animal users are required to follow all relevant standards, including the Animal Welfare Act Regulations, Public Health Service Policy, the Guide, the Ag Guide, and their ACUC-approved protocol.

			Protocols, SOPs, and Emergency Plans are current and available to view
			Records, including but not limited to: surgical, procedural, medical and/or treatment records, are current and available to view
			Staff Training Records are current and available to view
			Veterinary & Emergency Contact information is posted or accessible, and current
			Whistle-Blower Policy is posted and current

			Animal use areas are generally clean and well-maintained and risk of injury is minimized (safe flooring, no potential for entrapment, no protruding metal etc.)
			Animal surgery & procedure areas are clean with sanitizable surfaces(for surgery areas) & materials for survival and non-survival procedures are appropriately and labeled as necessary
			Animal feed & bedding are stored appropriately and labeled as necessary
			Sanitizing solutions are appropriate for use; containers have labels indicating expiration-, use by- or mixed on- date (<i>please indicate which is being used</i>)
			Transport vehicles are clean, functional, and appropriate (including any equipment used in transporting animals)
			Vermin Control measures are in place and documented

			All animals are checked daily for health/food/water and records of these checks are available, complete, and accurate
			Animals generally appear healthy and in good condition
			Sick animals are promptly reported to appropriate Veterinary Staff and/or treated per facility SOP and the treatment documented
			Animal holding areas are clean with appropriate food, water, and bedding (if applicable) provided. Food and water is not soiled and access is appropriate.
			Social Housing and Enrichment is provided according to campus policy

			Animals are checked daily according to facility SOP
			Fencing is well maintained
			Pasture is adequate for intended use (e.g. size, composition, grazing level, grazing density) and a thistle/weed control program is in place
			Shelter from the elements is either present or managed via facility SOP
			A fly/pest control program is in place
yes	no	n/a	Drugs, Chemicals, and Equipment
			Controlled substances are locked in secure area, logs and records are accurate, up to date, and available
			Drugs & pharmaceuticals (e.g. eye lube) are not expired and have labels indicating "expiration" or "use by" dates
			Chemicals, pesticides or other substances are labeled with chemical name and "expiration" or "use by" dates – instructions for use should be available
			Safety Data Sheets (SDS) are current and available to view
			Anesthesia machines have been calibrated within the last 12 months and have a sticker with inspection date visible



yes	no	n/a	Safety/Biosecurity
			Human food is kept out of enclosed animal areas and lab refrigerators
			Livestock restraint devices (e.g. Squeeze chutes, gating) are in good repair
			First Aid kits are available and do not contain expired materials
			Sharps (needles, injection ports etc.) are properly stored and sharps container is not overfull
			Fire Extinguisher certification is current
			PPE / Personal protection equipment (like shoe covers, gloves, coveralls, eyewear and respiratory protection) is available and consistently used
			Eye wash stations are tested (flushed) weekly and test log is posted and up to date
			Cardboard boxes , including broken glass boxes, are stored off the floor to prevent soaking during mopping or water leaks
